Guidelines for Percutaneous Endoscopic Gastrostomy and Percutaneous Endoscopic Jejunostomy Gabriele Roveron, President of AIOSS

In 2012, The Italian Associations of Endoscopic Technical Operators (ANOTE*) and Gastroenterology Nurses (ANIGEA*) joined with the Stomal Therapy Scientific Association (AIOSS**) in drawing up Guidelines for Percutaneous Endoscopic Gastrostomy (PEG) and Percutaneous Endoscopic Jejunostomy (PEJ).

The joint project began with an identification of critical points of the clinical pathways of patients with PEG / PEJ and with the establishment of a multidisciplinary working group made up of members from the involved associations. The group included not only people with clinical skills, but also those with experience in critical evaluations of the literature and in the development methodology of the guidelines.

Identified Clinical Questions:

- Patient preparation for the PEG / PEJ procedure and periprocedural monitoring;
- Stoma and tube care, intake and the prevention of errors related to nutritive formula and drugs;
- Management of early and late PEG / PEJ complications;
- Patient and/or caregiver training on the management of feeding tubes and the administration of drugs or nutritive formula; and
- Replacement of gastrostomy and jejunal tubes.

Following the research, review and critical appraisal of the literature referring to each clinical question, grading was performed, and specific recommendations were formulated based on these conclusions.

After this procedure, we consulted an expert group (comprised of gastroenterologists, general surgeons, nutritionists and hospital and homecare nurses) to resolve those critical points for which there was no high scientific level of evidence. A subsequent Consensus Conference with all stakeholders from the field (representatives of the major scientific associations and societies and patient associations) was held, to contribute to the validation of the work.

It was possible to disseminate the contents of the Guideline not only through national and local events organised by the promoting associations, but also through National Board of Nurses conferences.

AIOSS will take on the task of disseminating the Guideline internationally, to make this new knowledge available to all professionals. Transferred in different contexts, this may



encourage critical thinking and lead the way to new studies. To support this, we prepared an English summary of the Guideline in a scientific article to be published in an international journal indexed by Medline and CINAHL.



World Ostomy Day in Slovenia

In October 2018, we marked World Ostomy Day 2018 at a meeting of the Enterostomal Therapists of Slovenia with the objective of discussing the quality treatment of patients with stoma, chronic wounds and incontinence. At the meeting, we presented drafts of guidelines for treating patients with ostomy, chronic wounds and incontinence in primary health care settings. We also discussed the updated draft guidelines for choosing and prescribing medical devices for patients with ostomy.

Enterostomal Therapy in the Republic of Croatia - Where are we today?

Today, enterostomal therapy in Croatia is slowly completing the first decade of active efforts to sensitise the profession of wound, incontinence and ostomy care. Compared to 2010, when we began with the first workshops where nurses learned about the importance of stoma marking and how to implement it, through today, in 2018, the planning of stoma positioning is carried out in a large number of hospitals in the Republic of Croatia.

Today, the Republic of Croatia has three nurses who specialise in the field of wound work, incontinence and stomas, thanks to a great professional association and international cooperation with the Republic of Slovenia. In many hospitals, the preparation for stoma patients now begins during the preoperative period, which represents the gold standard for health care delivery to stoma patients. In some hospitals, we have been able to create multidisciplinary teams that take care of stoma patients to connect hospital and outpatient care. Besides physicians and specially educated nurses (ET), members of the multidisciplinary team include physiotherapists, dieticians and social workers.

We are also continuously improving the processes of the planned release of the stoma patient and coordination of ET nursing in patients' homes. The ILCO Association of People with Stoma, in Zagreb, Croatia has traditionally celebrated an international day with stoma patients, promoting public health action in promoting the early recognition of malignant bowel disease. In the past four years, we have recorded a series of profiled workshops, professional conferences, conferences and nurses' symposia that cover most of the areas of wound work, incontinence and stoma problems. All of these activities have greatly influenced the development of enterostomal therapy and improved care for people with the problem of early stoma or incontinence. Considering the evident trends in the population's recovery from inflammatory bowel diseases, malignant diseases that can affect the appearance of stoma via surgical treatment, or the appearance of complex wounds, a nursing specialist focused on this area brings a whole range of benefits to both the patient and the socioeconomic system.

Research conducted on a group of patients at UHC Sestre Milosrdnice in the Clinic for Tumours (ET patients and members of the ILCO European Ostomy Association) demonstrated the need for and effectiveness of the multidisciplinary approach to stoma patients' care.

This year, nurses have been educated in stoma care according to the WCET guidelines. This represents a future potential for the development of the nursing profession. We believe that by increasing the number of specialised nurses in general, as well as in stoma care, the quality of care in the health care systems will be improved, to the benefit of individuals living with non-healing wounds, incontinence and ostomy.
